



I am writing this letter to express my gratitude to Enrique Garcia and his crew. They have just completed the Mt. Hebron planting contract which consisted of 2,098 acres. This is the largest planting program the Goosenest district has had in a long time. There were many challenges to overcome in order to complete this project. What we thought would be difficult and complex, Enrique assured us that "it is no big deal".

With varied terrain the species mix had to be constantly adjusted to fit ground conditions. Enrique would always check species mix for the next "bag up", if needed, he would rearrange planters on the hill to fit site conditions. His willingness to work with us on this issue improved planting quality.

The nursery had grown about 10M of extra-large Douglas-fir. These were a problem to plant as they required shovels and reduced the number of trees planters could carry. Enrique once again assured us that "it was no big deal". Planters used shovels, carried fewer trees and quickly worked through the problem.

Safety on this project was an issue from the beginning due to a high density of snags and often windy conditions. On one occasion, I was concerned about some gusty winds and suggested we all call it a day. He readily agreed even though it was still early in the day.

In summary, Enrique and his crew was a joy to work with. They were enthusiastic about their work, had good comradery with each other and seemed happy to be working hard.



## Scope 3.1

### Forest Management Hand Crew

(Responses to questions, statements and/or sections in the Scope of Work, Section 3 of the RFP)

## *Forest Management Hand Crew Services Specification*

3.1.1 The awarded vendor will provide skilled hand crew services to complete forest management-related work, including but not limited to:

3.1.1.1 Fuels reduction

*Fuels reduction is a very important component of the business for Summitt Forests. Fuels reduction projects encompasses many different types of work, including but not limited to, Thinning, Release and Brushing, Hand Piling and Covering, Buck, Lop and Scatter, Chipping, Fireline Construction, Felling Trees and/or Brush, Limbing, Piling and Pile Burning, and Herbicide Application. The following descriptions are typical of how we perform the individual class of work, however, we will address variations in any Task Order to be in compliance with the requirements of that Task Order.*

### *Thinning*

*Prior to beginning work on a unit, the foreman will go over the specifications and prescriptions to that unit with all of the crew so there is an understanding of the objectives prior to work beginning. Summitt's crew members will work in a line format, at a safe distance between people, so that the entire area is covered in a systematic manner. The crew will not be haphazardly spread throughout the unit. The foreman will be directly behind the crew assessing quality and checking work. When defects are found he can make immediate corrections by having the crew member involved do the rework. Leave trees will be selected by each crew member based on the prescription for the unit. Normally the dominant or co-dominant are selected as leave trees if they are healthy, of good form and vigor, and of the species desired. All crew members are experienced in tree selection and spacing, with a background in thinning. Cut trees and slash will be fell away from leave trees for their protection. The foreman will use a tape measure and will take spacing plots with each worker so that there is a full understanding of the density of leave tree desired. Any slash treatment will normally be conducted at the time of thinning. Pull back from roads, streams or other areas will be conducted on a daily basis. Cutting around these areas will normally be directional away from the improvement. Normally a crew of 8 to 15 people is used to complete this work.*

### *Release and Brushing*

*All vegetation will be cut and or grubbed using chainsaws or hand tools as prescribed in a task order to release the selected trees. Normally 8 to 15 people are used per crew for this type of work. Crew members work together in a line format to systematically cover the area treated.*

### *Hand Piling and Covering*

*When piling is prescribed along with cutting, a portion of the crew will complete the piling directly behind the cutting operations. Usually there are 3 people piling along with one person using a saw to do additional bucking and cutting when it is necessary. The groups will work*

*in a line format to systematically cover the area. The foreman will visually inspect the work as it takes place to insure specifications are being followed. Any areas not substantially meeting the requirements will require rework of the affected area. Piles are normally located away from leave tree crowns, away from roads, streams or improvements.*

*All prescribed slash will be piled to meet the task order specifications. Piles will be located away from stream beds, logs or stumps. Piles will be constructed and trimmed in a manner so they are compact and will facilitate later burning. If required, a piece of approved water proof material as prescribed by the task order will be placed in the pile to keep the central portion of the pile dry for easy ignition at the time of burning. A crew of 12 to 30 people is normally used for this work.*

### *Buck, Lop and Scatter*

*When lop and scatter is prescribed, it will be done by a crew of 4 to 15 people dependant on the size of the task order. The crew will use chain saws to complete the work as prescribed. They will cover the area in an evenly spaced, systematic.*

### *Chipping*

*Where chipping is prescribed, Summitt's crew of 3 to 6 people will use either our Bandit 250 HP, 18 inch chipper with grapple or our Bandit 140 HP 14 inch chipper to chip material up to the specified diameter in the task order. This chippers can be towed behind a normal sized truck and can be used on most forest roads. If a chipper of a different size is needed, it can be rented by Summitt. The crew will chip the material and blow it back into the thinning area or into a truck for removal as prescribed. Summitt also has a skid-steer with Fecon mastication head that would be available for mastication task orders.*

### *Fireline Construction*

*A crew of 4 to 15 people are normally used for this type of work. The crew is divided into three basic groups. Cutters, who use chainsaws to cut the trees and slash out of the path where the fireline is to be located. Other crew members then scatter that material back into the unit to be burned, and the grubbing portion of the crew cuts the fireline using hand tools down to mineral soil. The clearing area and grubbed area will be to the size as prescribed in the task order.*

### *Felling Trees and/or Brush*

*A crew of 4 to 15 people would be used to complete the site preparation slashing associated with this item of work. Damaged or designated trees and brush as prescribed will be cut and lopped to the ground. Cut trees will be fell away from leave trees or other improvements.*

### *Limbing*

*Trees prescribed to be limbed will be pruned with chainsaws or hand pruning saws to the prescribed height, but no more than 50% of the live crown will be removed. Limbs will be removed ¼ inch from the bole of the tree. Care will be used during pruning to avoid damage*

*to the bole of the tree. Slash will be scattered away from the base of the tree. If the slash is to be chipped or piled, it will be done in the same manner as described above.*

### *Pile Burning*

*Our Fire and Fuels Management is overseen by Barry Ledbetter. Barry's background and experience come from U.S.F.S. hand and engine crews. Barry Ledbetter had 12 seasons of experience on the Middle Fork Ranger District, Willamette National Forest before joining Summitt Forests in the Fall of 2001.*

*Summitt will burn piles with a crew of 5 to 15 NWCG certified people, one certified RXB3 burn boss who will also be the representative for the project. The size of the crew will be dependent on the number of acres and piles to burn. If needed we will provide one type 6 engine, and can supply more if the size of the project and conditions warrant more engines. The crew will have drip torches for each person, and ATV's are available if needed for fuel and equipment transport.*

3.1.1.2 This item is blank in the RFP.

3.1.1.3 Tree thinning

*Tree Thinning can have more than one objective in Forest Management. The two most common objectives are for reducing Fuel Loads by managing stand structure, and to perform Timber Stand Improvement by reducing the number of trees per acres, appropriate to the age of the stand.*

*Tree Thinning, as applies to reducing Fuel Loads, usually has the objective of reducing Ladder Fuels in the stand structure, and reducing the number of trees per acre. Thinning for Timber Stand Improvement results in improved growth of the stand by making more sunlight, water, and nutrient available to the leave trees. Interestingly, both prescriptions often achieve both objectives.*

*Our general methodology for performing Thinning is described above under item 3.1.1.1.*

*Pesticide and Herbicide application will be discussed under Scope 3.4.*

3.1.1.4 Wildlife habitat improvement

*Many of the above described treatments affect wildlife habitat. Specific treatments with the goal of improving wildlife habitat are varied, depending upon the species of wildlife being managed. Some examples of manipulation of the environment to improve wildlife habitat include, but not limited to: Creating snags for nesting sites, clearing adjacent trees around a snag, altering stand structure to manage hiding and thermal cover, controlling noxious weeds and invasive species, controlling erosion, and improving range vegetation.*

*Summitt can perform Wildlife Habitat Improvement by a combination of hand work and mechanical methods, as prescribed. Summitt will address this work classification in individual Task Orders.*

#### 3.1.1.5 Erosion control

*Summitt can perform various types of erosion control using had crews with hand tools or mechanized equipment. Summitt owns hundreds of various hand tools that can be supplied to our crews, who are experienced in erosion control. Some examples of the type of erosion control, with had crews, that Summitt has performed, include but not necessarily limited to: construction water bars on roads and skid trails, digging and trenching along trails, seeding grasses and wildlife forage seed using hand seeders, rip-rap placement, installation of erosion fabric and other materials, and ditch and culvert cleaning.*

*Mechanized equipment for erosion control that Summitt owns include, but not necessarily limited to: 1990 John Deer 55- G Dozer, Ford Backhoe with Trailer, 2007 Cat 320 Excavator, 2007 ASV Skid-steer with attachments, and a 2006 mini forwarder with grapple.*

*See Scope 3.3 for a complete listing of equipment owned by Summitt.*

- 3.1.2 Crews will be provided with written prescriptions that contain specifications and other pertinent information for each project.

#### *Contract Staffing and Communication*

*Summitt's crews normally consist of 8 to 25 people on a crew with a foreman and inspector. The foreman and inspectors have vast amounts of experience in interpreting prescriptions and making sure that each member of the crew understands the requirements of the job. The size of the crew is dependent on the type of work, the amount to be done, and the time given. The crews usually work 5 to 6 days per week with Sundays off. The idea is for the crew to work as close to 40 hours per week as possible. The crew will be managed by a non working foreman who will be responsible for quality control and crew organization. A company manager may be on site when the project is started or will be available if there are any problems that arise during the completion of the contract. A company manager or the owner are always reachable by phone. All foremen also carry cellular phones for communication purposes. The foremen are instructed to contact the management staff on a daily basis to report progress and any potential problems on the project. The foreman will also be the contract representative and will have the authority to take on the ground instructions with regards to the contract.*

- 3.1.3 Travel to worksite may require driving on narrow, winding, native surface roads for long distances. During the summer months, frequent encounters with hikers, mountain bikers, and horseback riders should be expected.

*Summitt's crews regularly travel throughout the Western United States. Every conceivable travel situation has been encountered on public paved roads, as well as on rocky roads and native surface four wheel drive type roads. When traveling, as well as on the job site, Safety is*

*always a conscious and intentional component of the work day. Following is our Safety Policy, which is regularly reviewed by every crew that Summitt puts in the field. A complete copy of our safety plan can be supplied upon request.*

*Safety is a major priority, and has a major roll in the success of Summitt Forests Inc. as a company. It is taken seriously by all of our managers and foreman, and therefore by all of our employees. Summitt has a comprehensive safety program where all crews have safety meetings on a regular basis. Due to the nature of the work and all of the hazards involved, we have made it an important factor in our employment program. People who are not physically capable of doing the work are placed in other employment. In many situations we offer a safety bonus when crews work injury free. All vehicles are equipped with stretchers and first aid kits and cellular phones in each van so that if there is a serious injury it can be swiftly dealt with. When there is an injury, after medical attention has been given, it is to be immediately reported to the office. All injuries are then investigated by Scott Nelson to see if similar future situations can be avoided.*

#### *Required Safety Equipment PPE*

*All employees are required to wear shirts, long pants, boots and gloves. Summitt supplies each employee with a hard hat and it is required to be worn at all times on the job site. Additional special safety equipment such as overalls, respiratory protection, eye protection, hearing protection or chaps, if needed for the job, are provided by Summitt. Each crew has a cellular telephone for communication, and if cell service is not available will have a satellite phone for emergency use.*

*Summitt will conduct safety meetings prior to work beginning on the project. Each member of the crew will be involved in a discussion of the potential dangers involved in the work. At each site the foreman will make a visual assessment of the unit and will inform the crew of special circumstances within the area and to be extra alert with those dangers in mind.*

*Such factors as:*

*Lifting objects, and the proper methods of using the legs and not the back. Walking slowly while carrying weight, paying attention to the obstructions on the ground or in the ground. Pay attention to the ground surface conditions, if it is muddy or ashen, be extra careful due to*

*the prospect of poor footing. On burned units be careful when walking or working near stumps, due to the fact that the roots may have burned out underground leaving an unstable surface and the potential for a hole to develop underfoot. Always move carefully over uneven and especially steep slopes where a fall can be compounded by sliding or rolling a distance down slope. Always pay attention to possible limbs and dead trees falling from overhead, and stay clear.*

*Weather conditions will also play a roll in crew safety.*

*The crew will be notified of the potential of trees or portions of trees falling if the wind begins to blow. In high winds the crew may be stopped from working if excessive danger is present at the work site.*

*The foreman, and the inspector will assess the danger of falling limbs and the potential of falling snags within the unit. In conjunction with the government representative, if it is determined there is a danger present, and the wind is determined to be making those dangers a work hazard, the crew will be instructed to stay away from those portions of the unit. If there is no safe location with that unit, they will be moved to a safe unit, or will be stopped from work.*

*If sever storms are present in the area, members will be informed to stay out of steep creek beds if it begins to rain, or heavy rains are seen upstream.*

*If lighting becomes evident and close to the work area the crew may be stopped from working until the storm has passed.*

*All crew personnel will be instructed to be aware that the weather conditions can change rapidly during this time of year. If sever weather approaches, work may be stopped at any time and to be aware of where all other crew members are working, and where the foreman is located and be ready for instructions.*

#### *Driver Training and Vehicle Maintenance*

*It is important for drivers to be well trained and take the task of driving seriously. We want to emphasize to all drivers the risk they assume when they are transporting workers. Proper safety and knowledge of ones vehicle can not only save the company money but can save heartache and injury.*

*All drivers are required to have a safe driving record and valid drivers license. Summitt requires all drivers to take an in house class on drivers safety and procedures that includes personal training by our mechanics on the safe and proper operation of the vehicles they will be using. Our mechanics have an outline for successful safety talks that are used during the class. The class involves individual training going over the vehicle from top to bottom, the driver actually road testing the vehicle, and being tested on that operation. Such road tests are included in this safety plan. Drivers are instructed to contact the police and emergency services in case of an accident and to notify the office as soon as possible. They are shown where the first aid kit is and will generally trained in CPR if they are also a foreman.*

## ***Spill Plan***

***Summitt Forests is committed to safe and secure transportation and use of gasoline, oil and diesel in all locations of work. Spill kits containing; 25 pounds of litter, two 30 gallon garbage bags with ties, broom, dust pan, square shovel, and round shovel will be present at each storage area.***

***Action will be taken to safely contain the spill and prevent it from flowing into streams, lakes or other wet areas. We will keep the contamination to a minimum and will remove all contaminated dirt or other items to be disposed of properly.***

***The land owner will be notified immediately in the case of a spill. A HAZMAT team will be contacted, or the National Response Center at 1-800-424-8802. The spill will also be reported to OERS at 1-800-452-0311.***

## ***Safety Records***

***Basic safety meeting records are kept for major safety meetings, inspection records for work vehicles and equipment are kept on file. All accident reports are filed and used for training where appropriate. Accident and safety records are kept by the Injury and Safety Coordinator.***

- 3.1.4 Crews must be able to work in difficult terrain that may include steep, rocky slopes, and areas of dense trees with large, unstable snags, poor footing and exposure to adverse weather. In addition, some work may be required in urban environments and may contain such hazards as structures, trees, power lines, and vehicles.

***Summitt's crews regularly travel and work throughout the Western United States. Every conceivable topographic and weather condition has been encountered on the various job sites that the crews encounter. Adverse weather and tough topography are routine to our crews.***

***When working on the job site, Safety is always a conscious and intentional component of the work day. Please refer again to our Safety Plan above in item 3.1.3.***

- 3.1.5 Work includes lifting rounds of wood and segments of logs, limb wood, and brush.

***Every crew member is required to be physically fit, as a condition employment. Training is regularly conducted to educate crew members in the safe and proper methods to lift and move heavy objects.***

- 3.1.6 Tree felling services will include the operation of chainsaws to complete felling, limbing, lopping, bucking and brushing activities according to written prescriptions.

***The following applies to items 3.1.6, and 3.1.6.1 through 3.1.6.9.***

***Summitt will perform tree felling services according to the unit prescription and as generally discussed in item 3.1.1***

- 3.1.6.1 Tree fellers must be able to directionally fell trees away from residual trees or objects to be protected.

***Protection of residual trees is always a goal of Summitt's crews. Our Tree Fallers have undergone training for falling and have experience in directional falling to accomplish the safety removal of the cut tree and to avoid damage to residual trees.***

- 3.1.6.2 Tree to be cut larger than six (6) inches in diameter will be marked with paint (color to be determined between awarded vendor and State's designee). Trees that are less than six (6) inches in diameter may be designated by description.

***Summitt will follow the prescriptions for each task order.***

- 3.1.6.3 Trees range in size from one (1) inch to twenty-four (24) inches DBH.

***Summitt will follow the prescriptions for each task order and will have cutters qualified to cut trees up to 24 inches in diameter when needed.***

- 3.1.6.4 Cut trees in area not designated for firewood sales must be limbed on all sides, bucked into four (4) foot lengths and stacked for burning, depending on the prescription.

***Summitt will follow the prescriptions for each task order.***

- 3.1.6.5 In areas designated for firewood sales, cut trees larger than eight (8) inches in diameter must be limbed on all sides, bucked into four (4) foot lengths, and stacked for removal by individuals purchasing firewood permits.

***Summitt will follow the prescriptions for each task order.***

- 3.1.6.6 Borax will be applied to all freshly cut green evergreen tree stumps larger than ten (10) inches in diameter to prevent the spread of root disease.

***Summitt will follow the prescriptions for each task order, and has licensed applicators who can safely apply the borax.***

- 3.1.6.7 Maximum stump height is six (6) inches above high ground level.

***Summitt will follow the prescriptions for each task order.***

3.1.6.8 Trees that are less than six (6) inches must be flush cut.

*Summitt will follow the prescriptions for each task order.*

3.1.6.9 Typical brush species are primarily ceanothus, manzanita, oak, and chinkapin, and are mostly three (3) to six (6) feet high. Designation for brush removal is generally by description (e.g. remove fifty (50) percent of the brush) to reduce fuel continuity.

*Summitt will use chainsaws, brush cutters or mastication equipment as prescribed in the task order.*

3.1.7 Disposal of cut material will be accomplished by hand piling for burning, chipping, scattering, and/or removal from site, as designated by the project manager. Any piling must be located so that live trees are not scorched during the burning process. Piling locations will be decided by awarded vendor and the State's designee. Accurate recordation for hours of use and biomass produced is required.

*Summitt will perform Disposal of Cut Materials according to the unit prescription and as generally discussed in item 3.1.1*

3.1.8 Erosion control services that may be requested include routine light maintenance on roads and trails that can be done by hand, such as digging, trenching and/or removing sedimentation from drainage structures installed along park roads and trails. Other erosion control may include tilling, application of fertilizer, seeding, mulching, irrigation, and the application and establishment of erosion control materials (i.e., geotextile fabric).

*See item 3.1.1.5 above. Summitt can supply the hand crews or light mechanical equipment needed to make these types of applications.*

- 3.4.1 In accordance with NRS 555, vendors must have a Nevada Custom Pest Control. *Continue to 3.4.2.*
- 3.4.2 License issued by the Nevada Department of Agriculture in the appropriate pesticide category(s) prior to submitting a proposal. Questions regarding this requirement should be addressed to the Nevada Department of Agriculture at (775) 688-1180. Any response submitted by a non-licensed vendor, or vendor that has “applied for” a license, will not be accepted. A copy of the license or the license number must be submitted with response.  
*Summitt Forests, Inc. – Nevada Pest Control Business License, Permanent Nevada License No. 6728. A copy of the license can be found under the State Documents Tab.*
- 3.4.3 Records, application documentation and labels must be available on site.  
*Summitt acknowledges this.*
- 3.4.4 Awarded vendor must have the ability to take spot weather to determine temperature, wind speed, and relative humidity.

*Summitt regularly measures weather conditions as a routine practice on herbicide/pesticide Application Projects, including: Temperature, Wind Speed and Direction, Relative humidity. When conditions are outside the allowable application parameters as prescribed by the product label or the Task Order from the RFP, Summitt will halt Application until conditions permit.*

- 3.4.5 Spot, whole tree, and broadcast treatments may be required in some cases.

*Summitt has completed many herbicide/pesticide application projects of various types for the government and private land owners over our 28 plus years of contracting, which includes foliar, broadcast, spot, whole tree, hack and squirt, cut stump, and basal methods. *Following is a summary of that Equipment:*

*Summitt has the best equipment in the industry, we have manufactured our own power hose reels that allow us to extend as much as 1500 feet of high pressure hydraulic hose into a unit and retrieve it in a matter of minutes. 3.4.7 Application equipment must be cleaned daily and must be easily operable and easily metered. *This is routine practice for Summitt.*

3.4.8 To prevent drift, spraying operations will be halted when sustained wind speed is greater than or equal to eight (8) mph, or when the State's designee determines that there is the potential for drift off the project site. *Summitt Acknowledges this and maintains observation and records of weather conditions when work is in progress.*

3.4.9 Routine inspections will be done by a qualified State designee. *Summitt Acknowledges this.*

3.4.10 Mixing tanks must be equipped with portable containment systems and clean-up materials/tools.

3.4.11

*Batch tanks are equipped with back flow devices, shut off valves and quick connect hoses. Additionally they contain spill kits and hand tools. Summitt Forests is committed to safe and secure transportation and use of herbicides and pesticides in all locations of work. Spill kits containing; 25 pounds of litter, two 30 gallon garbage bags with ties, broom, dust pan, square shovel, and round shovel will be present at each storage area and batch truck.*

*The land owner will be notified immediately in the case of a spill. A HAZMAT team will be contacted, or the National Response Center at 1-800-424-8802. The spill will be reported to OERS 1-800-452-0311.*

3.4.12 Metering equipment and replacement spray nozzles must be available on project site. Summitt Acknowledges this and keeps many spare parts available on site included various sizes of spray nozzles and tips which may be used on the project.

3.4.13 Awarded vendor for Pesticide Application will be required to carry Pollution Liability and Pollution Legal Liability Insurance. (See Attachment E of this document for minimum requirements).

*Summitt's Certificate of Insurance, showing Limited Pollution Liability, and associated limits of coverage is found in Tab 4, under State Documents.*

3.4.14 If preventative tree spraying is done, tank pressures need to be at least 400 pounds per square inch (psi) in order to reach the tops of some trees.

*As shown in our equipment list, under 3.4.6 above, Summitt has several sprayers capable of delivering a spray in excess of 400psi. We have extensive experience with whole tree spraying and our system can reach heights of over 60 feet from the ground effectively. Lift trucks can be rented for spraying to extended heights. Please see our herbicide application spreadsheet under tab 9 (other information).*

3.4.15 Whole tree bark beetle preventative insecticide spraying will require that the main trunk is sprayed until dripping up to a top diameter of five (5) inches. *Summitt Acknowledges this. See above.*

**Controlled Fire Specification**

*(Responses to questions, statements and/or sections in the Scope of Work Section 3 of the RFP)*

### 3.8 Controlled Fire Specification

- 3.8.1 Crews to apply controlled fire to natural vegetation under specified conditions and after precautionary actions have been taken to ensure that the fire is confined to a predetermined area, in compliance with NRS 527.

*Summitt can provide a five person hand crew with one FFT1(Firefighter Type 1) (squad boss) or higher and 4 FFT@ (at minimum) for this project. Each Squad would have one 4x4 vehicle, at least one chainsaw with a minimum 18" bar and a minimum of 2 programmable radios. Each person on crew will be equipped with all PPE and hand tools for firefighting, Summitt currently has an Interagency Crew Agreement for 20 person hand crews managed by the Oregon Department of Forestry.*

*Summitt can also provide one or more Type 6 Engine with 2 person crew (1ENGB and 1 FFT2), and one Type 2 Tender with Operator. The Engine and Tender are currently approved for the R6 Engine/Tender agreement through the USFS.*

*Our hand and engine crews are trained by the Wildland Forestry Association, and have a current MOU with the Pacific Northwest Wildfire Coordinating Group for incident training. All Training meets NWCG standards. All firefighters qualifications are approved yearly by Oregon Department of Forestry (Crew Agreement) or the USFS (Engine/Tender Agreement), or both.*

*Refer to additional pages for this scope following item 3.8.5, that describe our firefighting personnel and their qualifications.*

- 3.8.2 Awarded vendor must be able to write a controlled fire plan. The plan must be prepared by a person qualified to oversee a controlled fire, be approved by the State Forester prior to implementation, and contain at least:

*Summitt has been providing firefighting services since 2003, as documented following 3.8.5. We have the trained and certified employees to accomplish these services, as well as the necessary equipment. We have had some transition in personnel, but are in the process of recruiting or finding a consultant qualified to write a controlled fire plan. We expect to have this accomplished prior to start of contract, at which time we will submit their documentation of qualifications.*

- 3.8.2.1 A description and map of the area to be burned

*Area maps will be submitted with each Controlled Fire Plan. Maps will include, at a minimum, the burn unit boundaries, the surrounding area, partition units into daily burn*

*blocks, adjacent landowners, nearby structures and improvements, anticipated direction of smoke plume, and smoke sensitive areas.*

- 3.8.2.2 A list of personnel and equipment necessary to commence and control fire.

*Refer to Qualifications sheet following 3.8.5 (2012 Summitt Forests, Inc. / Summitt Enterprises, Inc. Qualifications), for summary of qualified personnel.*

- 3.8.2.3 A description of the meteorological factors that must be present before commencing a controlled fire, including surface wind speed and direction, transport wind speed and direction, minimum mixing height, minimum relative humidity, maximum temperature and fine fuel moisture.

*Prior to starting any burn, an evaluation of weather and environmental conditions will be evaluated, to determine if a burn can continue safely and as planned. Summitt owns the necessary equipment for measuring weather conditions, including but not limited to:*

*Surface Wind Speed: field anemometer*

*Wind Direction: Silva Ranger Hand Compass, or equalivent .*

*Transport Wind Speed and direction: National Weather Service*

*Minimum Mixing Height: National Weather Service*

*Relative Humidity: Psychrometer*

*Temperature: Dual Lazar Infrared Thermometer, for detecting hot spots, and a thermometer for ambient air temperature*

*Fine Fuel Moisture: Fuel Moisture scale*

- 3.8.2.4 A description of considerations related to common behavioral patterns of fires in the area to be burned, including various burning techniques, the anticipated length of the flame and the anticipated speed of the fire.

*Summit's Fire Manager or consultant will be responsible for writing the burn prescription based on the conditions at the specific site in which the burning will take place. Fire behaviors will be completely variable based on those conditions. Conditions considered include but are not limited to; fuel types, fuel moisture, fuel loads, fuel continuity and*

*weather. The techniques used for prescribed burn treatment can range from broadcast burn to spot burn or hand pile and burn. Flame length can range from minimal creeping fire with basically no flame to broadcast and spot burn flame lengths from 2 feet to 5 feet based on the conditions.*

3.8.2.5 The signature of the person who prepared the plan.

*Summit's Fire Manager or sub contractor will be responsible for writing the burn prescription, and will sign the plan.*

3.8.3 Before signing the written plan, the person qualified to oversee the fire must evaluate and approve the anticipated impact of the fire on surrounding areas which are sensitive to smoke (NRS 527.128).

*Part of the plan and the map of the fire plan, is to evaluate the effect of fire and smoke on the surrounding areas. All adverse conditions will be evaluated in the plan to determine if the unit can be safely burned. If, in the determination of our Fire Manager, this cannot be accomplished safely, we will make alternate recommendations to the State of Nevada.*

3.8.4 A direct supervisor, who is qualified to oversee such fires and crews, must remain on site for the duration of the fire.

*We have on staff persons with RxB2 and RxB3 who qualified to oversee crews. Refer to documentation following 3.8.5.*

3.8.5 Vendors must indicate in their response whether their personnel are NWCG qualified for prescribed fire positions, and must provide documentation to show qualifications with their response.

*All Training of our crew members meets NWCG standards. All firefighters qualifications are approved yearly by Oregon Department of Forestry (Crew Agreement) or the USFS (Engine/Tender Agreement), or both.*

*Refer to additional pages for this scope following item 3.8.5, that describe our firefighting personnel and their qualifications.*

## Fire Safety Program

Our fire safety program consists of five components: Training, Equipment, Fire Orders/Watch-Out Situations and LCES, Implementation/Accountability and an Emergency Medical Plan. All five are an integral part of providing a safe working environment for all personnel involved. In addition to these five components it is very important for our crew members to be aware of our Alcohol and Drug Awareness policy (see attached). Our goal as a company is to finish a job without injury. The training, leadership and equipment we provide our crews, gives them the best possible advantage to be injury free. However, even with the best intentions accidents can occur. Therefore, we have provided an emergency medical plan in the event of an accident. The following is a detailed plan of the above topics.

### Training:

Training is the first step in the prevention of injuries and accidents. Proper training, along with good equipment and leadership can go a long way in mitigating unwanted circumstances. All personnel with Summitt Forests who will be working under this contract will receive either the annual refresher training required for returning employees or the basic fire behavior classes required for all incoming recruits. These classes include; S-130, S-190, S0S, S-211, Your Fire Shelter, S-212, Work Capacity Fitness Test (WCFT), CPR and First Aid Training and Line Construction Training with shelter deployment drills. All sawyers will be expected to properly maintain and use a power saw safely and efficiently during our line construction portion of training.

Proper training and experience for all FFT-1s and Single Resource Bosses are documented to insure personnel are capable to safely make proper decisions for their positions. Their ability to provide leadership is crucial in mitigating injuries and providing the necessary response in the unfortunate event of a work-related accident. They are ultimately accountable for the safety of the crew. If unsafe practices are occurring it is their responsibility to take the necessary steps to curb the unsafe practice. The necessary action may be to relieve that individual of his or her duties if very candid but tactful conversations are unsuccessful.

All employees who operate a motorized vehicle will be required to have a valid driver's license and meet all conditions for private contractor companies operating under state and federal laws. All drivers must complete a driver's class administered by the company safety compliance manager, in which DOT driving regulations, vehicle maintenance requirements, drug testing procedures are discussed. Each driver also must submit a DMV driving record from their issuing state for review by company safety compliance manager. The drivers must also go on a "ride along" with one of three company mechanics, which are supervised and advised by the fleet manager in which they observe the drivers speed, awareness, breaking procedures, and ability to make decisions. Summitt's crews will contain multiple drivers to mitigate any hazards associated with travel to and from the job site. All drivers will be expected to follow agency protocol when operating fire vehicles. Such protocol includes but is not limited to obeying the speed limit, driving with lights on, facing the danger when turning around, using chocks on vehicles and facing vehicles towards the exit route when parked.

### Equipment:

Safety equipment is the next step in preparing for safety. All personnel will be issued and required to wear and or use personal protective equipment appropriate for assignments and tasks. Hardhats (w/chin straps and shrouds), Nomex shirts and pants, gloves, eye and ear protection, shelters, boots, headlamps, flagging, first aid kits, radios, weather kits, chaps, glow sticks and tool guards are a part of standard equipment issued and used with our crew.

Expected safety practices of our crews include the use of hardhats at all times when outside of vehicles. Sleeves will be rolled down when working and when sharpening all tools and personal protective equipment including chaps, eye and ear protection and gloves will be worn when operating power saws. All the above gear, is expected to be used when operating or working near equipment and machinery that includes but is not limited to the following: pumps, dozers, helicopters (transportation, long-line, bucket and burning operations), engines and or tenders.

All tools and equipment used are of the best quality possible. Our crew is responsible for routinely maintaining equipment. Hand tools are checked for sharpness, loose heads and cracked handles. Power saws are cleaned,

sharpened, gassed and oiled at the end of everyday. Saws are chapped when hiking to and from project sites each day. Routine maintenance mitigates potential problems that may become a safety issue.

Summitt Forests has three full time mechanics and one part time mechanic on payroll, responsible for routine maintenance and upkeep of all vehicles. Routine and major work can be done in house at Summitt's shop and headquarters located in Phoenix, OR. However it will be the responsibility of the crew drivers to conduct the *Drivers Vehicle Inspection Reports* (DVIR) on the vehicles each morning prior to leaving work. This includes checking fluid levels, belts, condition of the tires, batteries, lights, blinkers, horn, brakes, brake lights, windshield, mirrors, wipers, reverse lights, first aid kit, flares, spare tire, jack and accessories, seat belts and others. Once a month, if necessary crew will fill out a complete checklist of pre-flight duties and turn into our fleet manager. Summitt is also enrolled in the Driver check program through our insurance company. The program issues us stickers to put on our vehicles which have an identification number and phone number to call in the event that a driver is speeding, driving erratically, or in case of emergency. If a situation is reported to Driver check we are notified within about 20 minutes by email. At that time we can contact the driver and resolve the situation. We feel this is a very good program to help us monitor our drivers.

#### **Fire Order, Watch-Out Situations and LCES:**

Summitt Forests takes fire-line safety very seriously. Fire Management has made it a goal not to forget the lessons of past tragedies. Man Gulch, Storm King and Thirty-Mile reinforce the importance of proper training, experience and the need to follow the three checklists of safety; Fire Orders, Watch-Out Situations and LCES. We stress the importance to our crew bosses, squad bosses and fit-2s the importance of using their knowledge and experience to determine safety and if necessary DO NOT BE AFRAID TO SAY 'NO WAY!' Our Crews are directed that if there is a hazard and you can not mitigate the hazard then we should not be doing the job!! Our leadership has been involved in many situations where they or one of their superiors have had to turn down assignments due to safety or a lack of. Each incident directly related to LCES, Fire Orders or Watch-Out Situations.

#### **Implementation and Accountability:**

Our supervisors are ultimately responsible for the implementation of safety. Prior to work the Crew boss will hold tailgate safety sessions. Items discussed will include weather, fire behavior, assignments and safety information needed for the day. A crew briefing will then be held to inform the crew. Squad Bosses will be expected to assist in the crew briefing and implementation of the days tasks, safety and observations of fire behavior and weather.

Implementation and accountability are directly reflected in additional safety pay, and/or bonuses to Crew Bosses, Squad bosses and crew members during which times they have had no significant accidents.

#### **Emergency Medical Plan:**

The crews will always be in communication with the local Ranger Station dispatcher and/or Incident Management team personnel. They will be outfitted with Bendix King programmable radios for communication. Local emergency phone numbers (located in shift plan) and cell phones will be convenient in all vehicles. As a minimum, supervisors will have CPR and First Aid training. Vehicle first aid kits will be available in each vehicle and there will be 4 five-person field first aid kits with the crew at all times. In the event of a serious injury, the supervisor will immediately notify dispatch and/or Incident management personnel and take the necessary steps for medical attention. These steps, upon discussion with dispatch and qualified personnel on the best course of action, may include transporting the injured person to the nearest medical facility for emergency medical attention or to a medivac location described in the daily shift plan.



## **Fire Training Program**

Summitt Forests Inc. is a member of two certified wildland fire associations. Wildland Forestry Association (WFA) and National Wildfire Suppression Association (NWSA). All training is performed by members of these two associations. Most of Summitt training is completed at the newly completed training facility on the company complex. The Training facility includes two class rooms capably of power point presentations, video presentations, multiple dry erase boards for class participation and large outside areas for hands on training.
