BA winners find success in Neva

Nearly two decades ago, Ron Bishop was a bored 18 year old stuck in the desert.

From that beginning, he took an un-usual path to owning the highly successful Bishop Air Services, and for his efforts, he has been named the U.S. Small Business Admistration's Nevada Small Business Person of the Year.

"Imoved to Las Vegas in 1983, be-cause I was sta-tioned at Nellis (Air Force Base). I grew to like the place during the four years I was stationed here. Bishop said.

He was far from the typical 18ear-old airman. Frained as a medic, Bishop excelled in the field of allergies

and immunology to the point where he was one of only two students in his class to be sent on for more training at Walter Reed Medical Center in Washington, D.C.

After a couple of his superiors in the medical field at Nellis left the air force unexpectedly, by default the young recruit found himself suddenly with a lot of responsibility.

"I was an 18-year-old kid and I didn't even have a stripe yet, and I was running this clinic," Bishop ex-

plained. "You had to be a sergeant to run the clinic. so they gave me the title of non-commissioned of-

Bishop soon found there were some perks to his new-found position: "I never had to take out the trash," he joked.

Realizing that he would need a lot more training in the civilian world to pursue a simi-lar career, Bishop started planning for the future while still in the Air Force, taking classes in air conditioning service at night.

After leaving the Air Force, Bishop decided to stick around the Las Vegas Valley and apply his trade work-ing for a hotel. At the urging of a friend, he

got a contractor's license at the age of 26.
"I was just looking to make some money on the side, a few hundred dol-lars," he recalled. "But it just took off. I had to quit my job and pursue it.




