Provide a description of work/services to be performed or commodity/good to be purchased:

A standard setting for the ACT assessment that creates cut scores, or proficiency levels, in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics for the purposes of federal and state reporting as required by state and federal law.

What are the unique features/qualifications required for this service or good that are not available from any other vendor:

A vendor for this scope of work must have a proven and thorough knowledge of the Nevada state assessment system from item level considerations to aggregate data analysis. A vendor must possess demonstrated expertise in conducting standard settings and staff the appropriate level of psychometricians to accomplish the complex processes leading to a successful outcome. A vendor must have demonstrated efficiency and cost effectiveness in leading standard settings and must empirically demonstrate the ability to consistently deliver standard settings on time and at the highest level of quality. The ideal vendor for Nevada would have significant experience in the state so as to provide continuity and consistency to the stakeholders engaged in the standard setting process.

The Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) is the only vendor with all of these unique qualifications. DRC has conducted five successful standard settings in Nevada and has extensive knowledge and experience with the nuances of Nevada education requirements and Nevada stakeholder needs. DRC provides continuity and consistency on the standard setting process leveraging their experience in leading successful standard settings in Nevada and their proprietary knowledge of the Nevada state assessments.

DRC has consistently met challenging timelines maintaining a high level of quality. DRC has been instrumental in helping NDE meet mandated deadlines. A new vendor would require a significant period of acclimation to Nevada assessments at the level required for this work and would critically impair the agency's ability to meet state and federal reporting responsibilities.

DRC is the only entity with the ability to conduct the standard setting in a timely manner to allow Nevada to remain in compliance with federal law and to ensure that Nevada is able to publish "star ratings" for high schools in accordance with state law.

Nevada's education initiatives are rooted in the ability to accurately hold schools and districts accountable for student achievement. The efforts of Nevada's Legislature and Governor have committed tax payer money toward the improvement of Nevada schools. NDE is tasked with providing accountability metrics that will be used to determine the efficacy of these reform initiatives and new resources. Failure to provide this accountability will make the evaluation of these programs impossible.

Explain why this service or good cannot be competitively bid and why this purchase is economically only available from a single source:

A competitive bid, because of the time required to complete the competitive bid process, will place the agency in a position of non-compliance with our federal reporting requirements for the ESSA §1111(b)(2)(B)(v)(I), and make it impossible to meet state reporting requirements including school ratings and designations. NRS 385A.720 requires that the Department publish school ratings on or before September 15 of each year. The law also requires that the Department provide an opportunity

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to school districts to review the data upon which the rating is based. This requires that the Department complete its analysis well in advance of the September 15 posting requirement.

DRC has consistently met challenging timelines on all Nevada standard settings and all other scopes of work and has consistently demonstrated a collaborative attitude and a high level of professional sensitivity to our work at the NDE. DRC is also the only vendor with the familiarity of Nevada's K-12 assessment system necessary to place this work in the appropriate context and has established credibility with stakeholders engaged in the standard setting process. Another vendor would not bring this level of continuity to the work. Additionally, for this scope of work, DRC is the only vendor in a position to complete the scope of work in time to avoid impacting required state and federal reporting dates in fall of 2018. Not meeting these dates will impact school allocations, school ratings, and federal and state reporting requirements. DRC is cost effective and when compared to similar work done by other vendors in other states, the work done by the current vendor is at a reasonable price point.

By design, a standard setting requires an intimate and comprehensive understanding of Nevada education initiatives, policies, laws; as well as significant experience with Nevada stakeholders.

DRC has been the Nevada state assessment vendor for the past four years and has consistently demonstrated a high level of knowledge on all aspects of Nevada education requirements. Participant surveys consistently rate DRC's standard setting performance as exceptional, and feedback cites a high level of technical achievement, precision and professional engagement. A new vendor would be unable to acquire the requisite level of knowledge of Nevada needs; not feasible in the required timeframe.

What are the potential consequences to the State if the waiver request is denied and the service or good is competitively bid?

The state will not comply with state and federal reporting requirements. Per federal law, the state must report 'proficiency' levels for student results; without a standard setting creating these proficiency levels, the state cannot meet federal law.

The use of proficiency levels is critical to the state's federal EdFacts reporting, the state's Nevada Report Card reporting, and to further the work on the state's Nevada School Performance Framework high school star ratings.

Without these proficiency levels, the state will not be able to provide performance data for state reporting requirements. These data are used in making school funding and school designation decisions. For example, weighted funding for English Learners and Free and Reduced Lunch students in the bottom quartile of student performance, class size reduction funding, determination of Comprehensive Support schools for federal school improvement funds, and host of other state programs and competitive funds are contingent upon ACT proficiency levels.

What efforts were made or conducted to substantiate there is no competition for the service or good and to ensure the price for this purchase is fair and reasonable?

The Nevada Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) for Assessments, which is made up of five assessment industry experts, provided the agency with potential vendors who could complete this scope of work. Only DRC could meet the proposed project schedule which also was the most cost efficient vendor.

Of the vendors provided, two cannot be used based on prior agency relationships. Two vendors, DRC and ACT, were contacted and estimates and schedules were provided by the vendors. The two estimates represented two ends of the cost spectrum. DRC submitted the lowest estimate and ACT submitted a cost estimate almost four times as much.
